

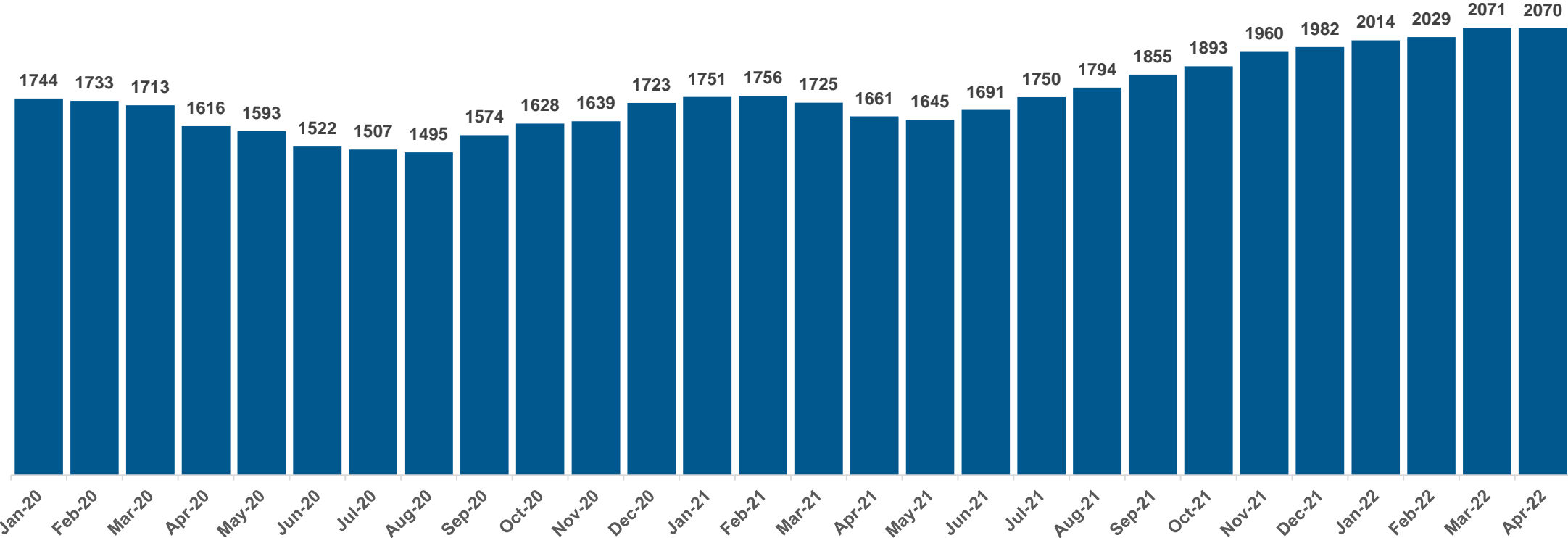

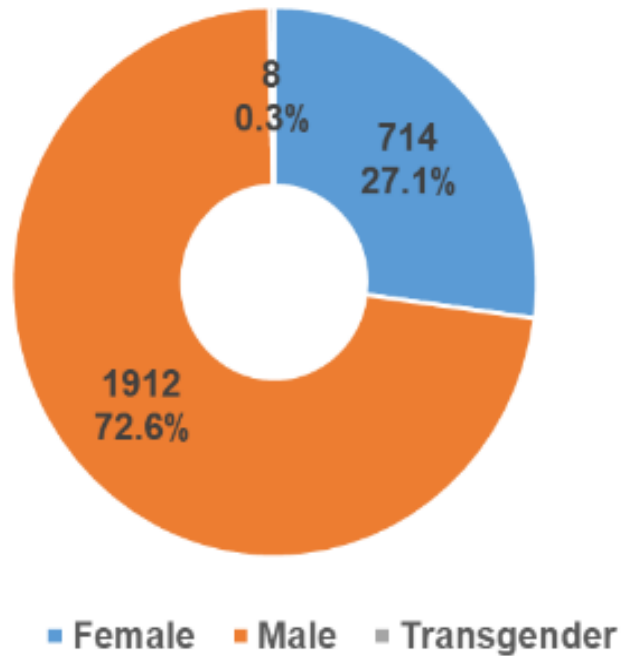
Shelter System Flow Data

Number of seniors actively homeless per month: Jan-2020 to Apr-2022

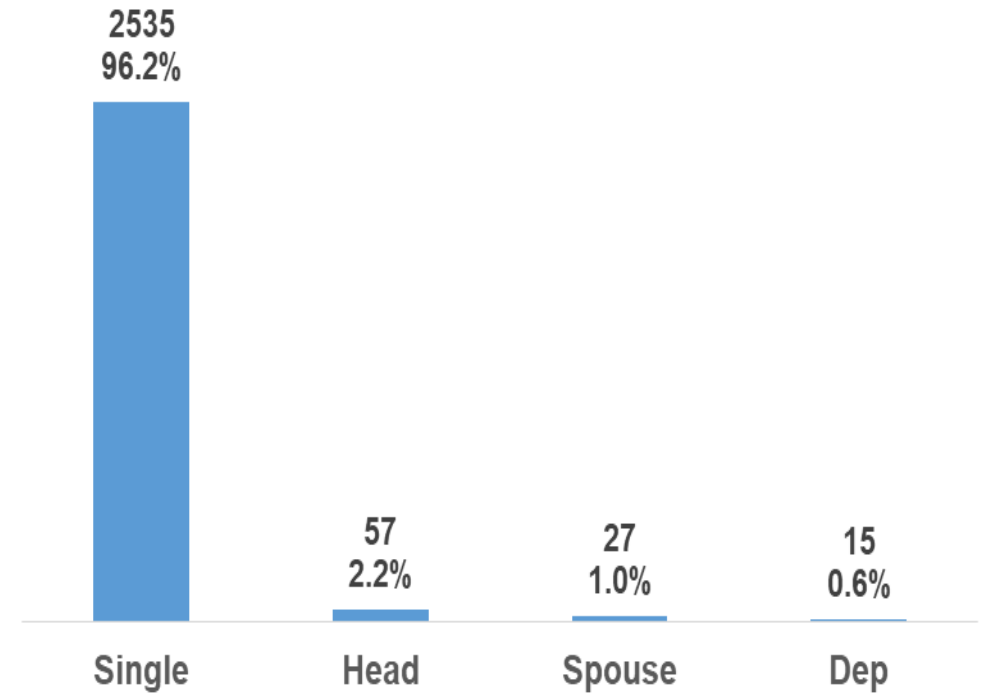


Gender and Family Status of Seniors

Gender breakdown for senior population

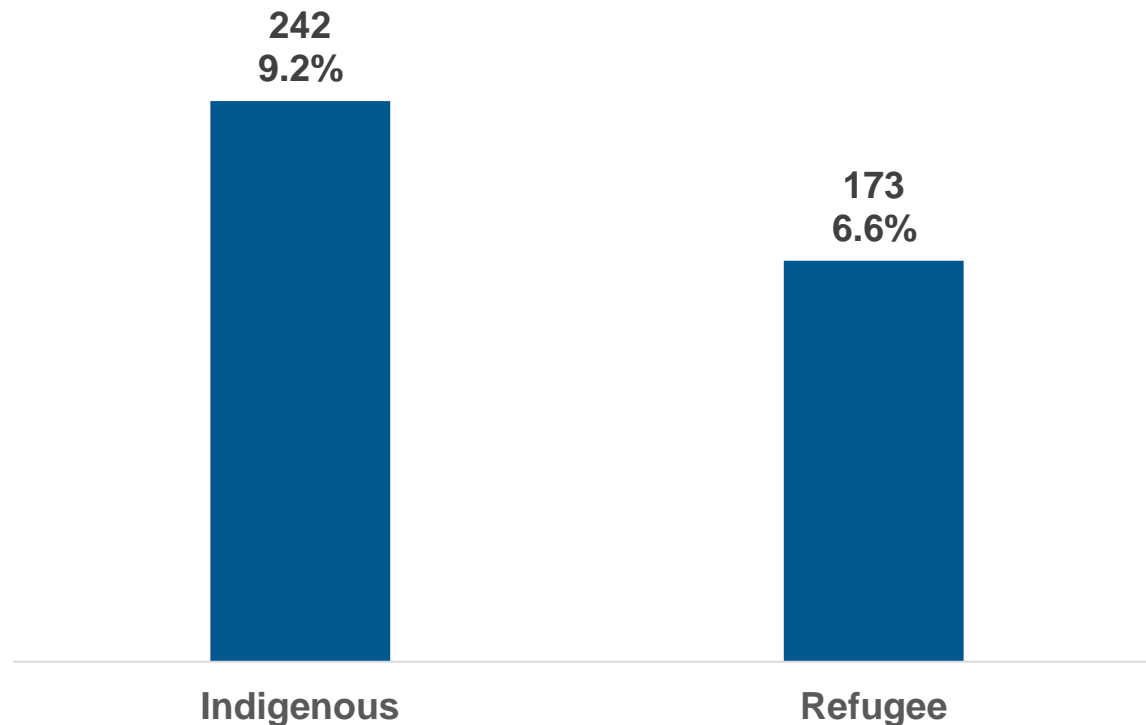


Family status of seniors

Proportion Indigenous and Refugee within senior population

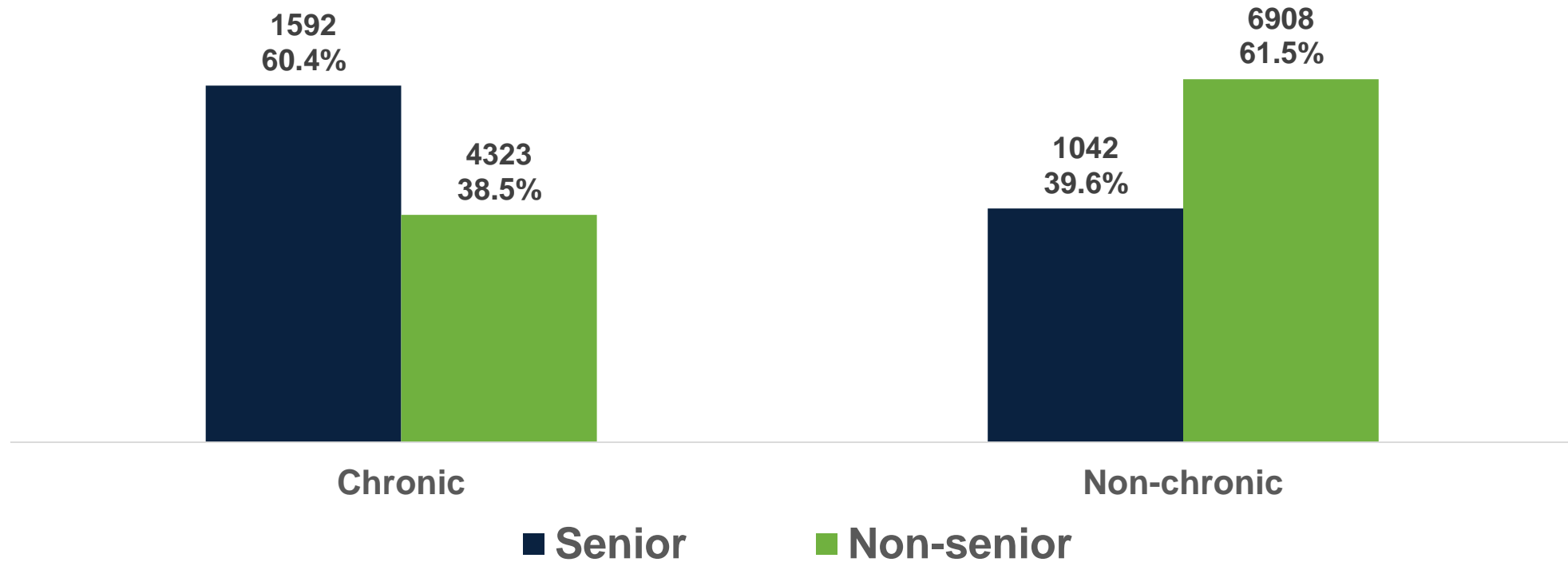


Compared to:

- 21.1% Refugee in the general BNL population

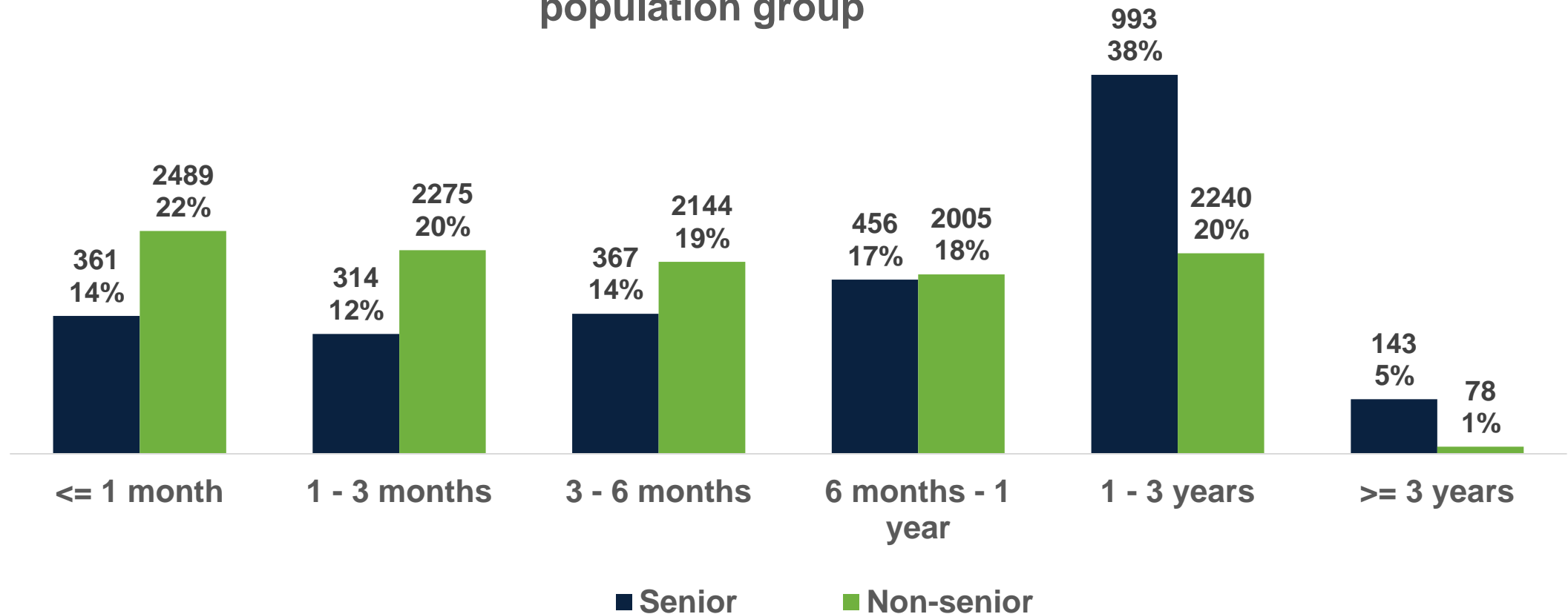
Seniors more likely to experience chronic homelessness

60% of seniors have experienced chronic homelessness



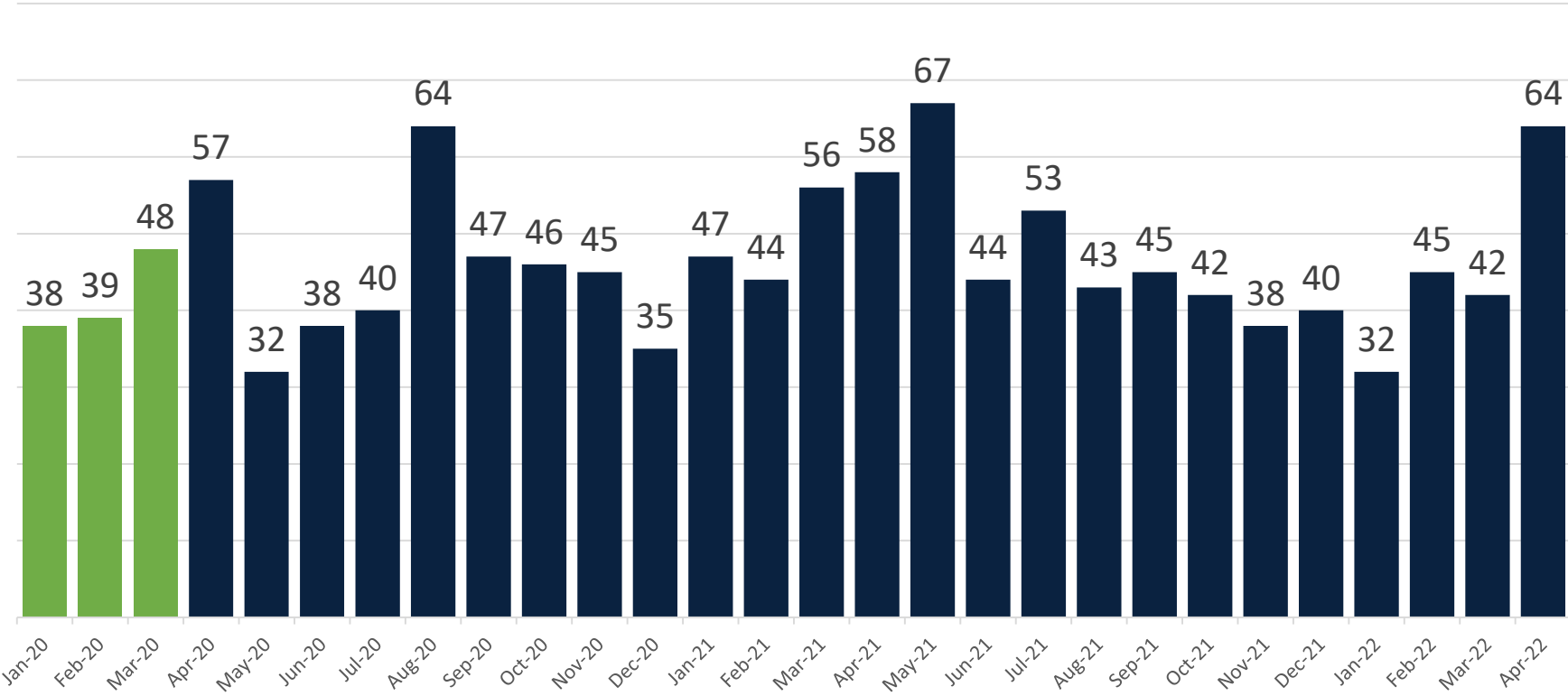
Length of stay

Estimating returns to shelter from permanent housing for seniors

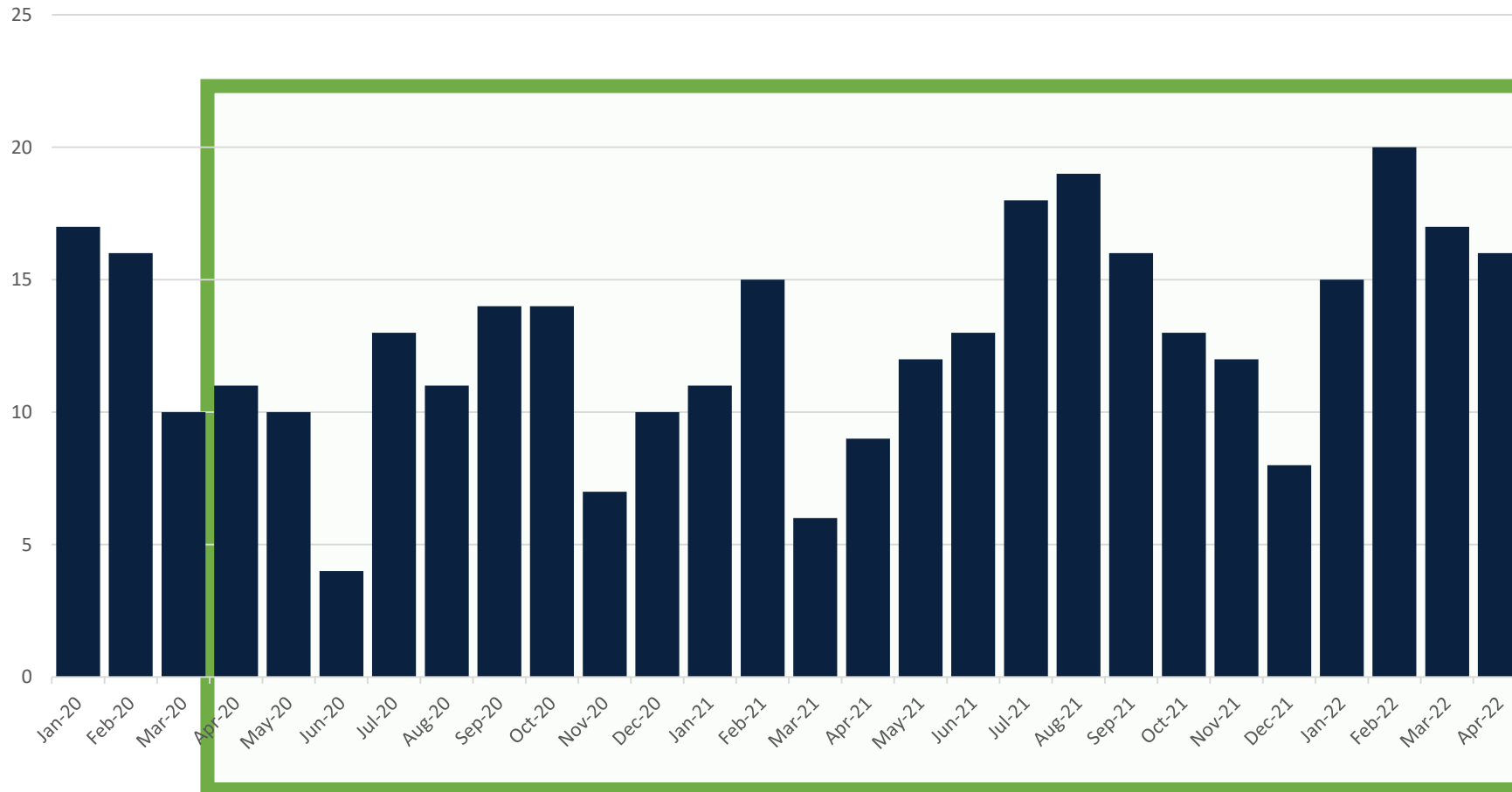
Number moved to permanent housing for senior population

Estimating returns to shelter from permanent housing for Seniors

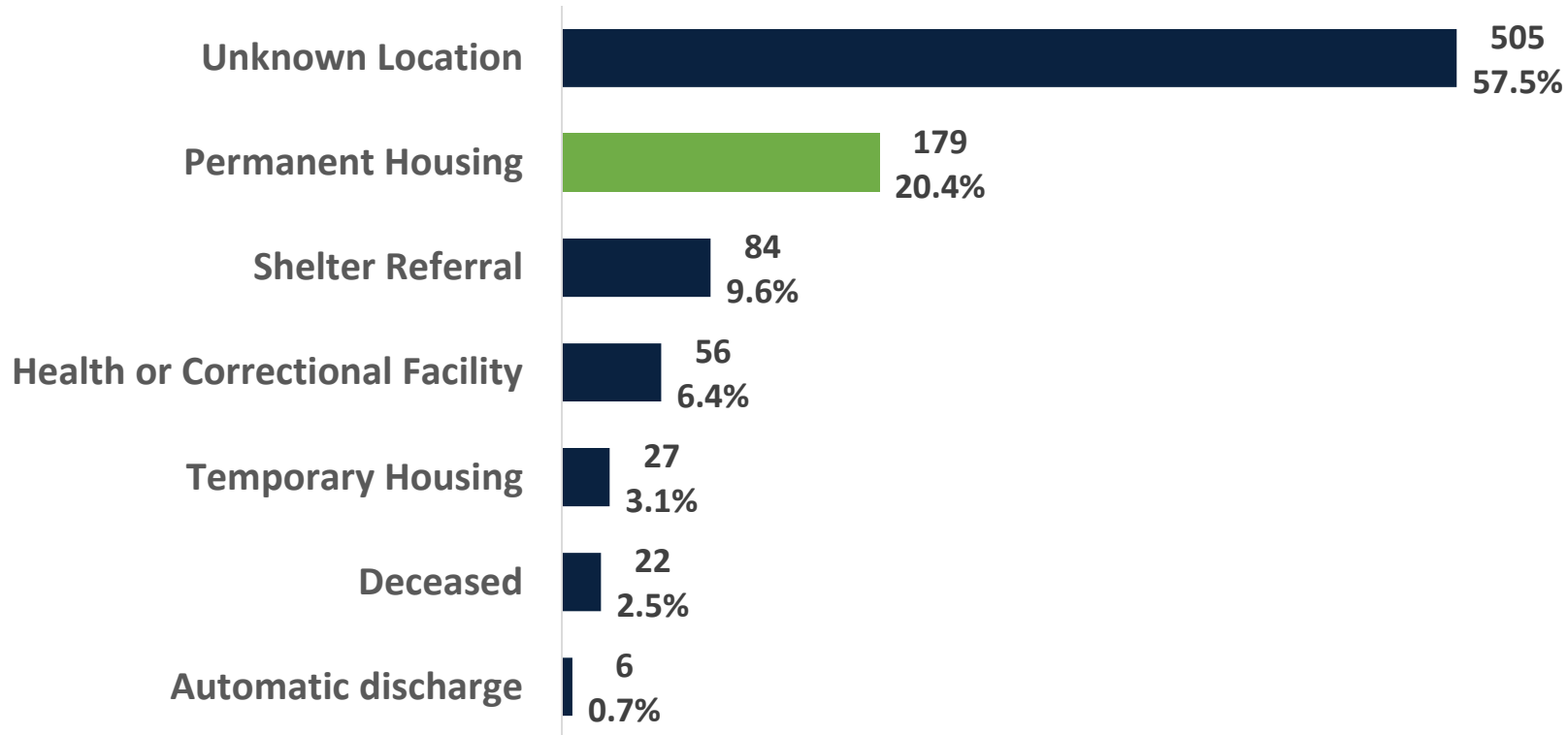
Monthly number of senior who returned to shelter from from Housing



11 seniors returned to shelter until Apr 2022. Return rate of **9.2%**

There were a total of **2634 unique seniors** from Jan - Apr 2022

33% (879) were discharged from shelter system

What are we doing

- Prioritizing seniors for access to supportive housing through the Priority Access to Housing and Supports (PATHS direct matching process)
 - Target is that 25% of all units allocated in 2022 will be dedicated to seniors
 - Considering how new modular housing opportunities can meet the needs of senior
- Funded additional follow-up supports specializing in seniors
- Continuing to work on opportunities with LTC to develop a specialized model for people experiencing homelessness
